From Chapter 39, Sri Sai Sat Charith.

Awareness - On the Path of Gnyana Yoga

Knowledge in its primitive level, is based more on gross vibrations, which means it relies more on verbal communication, physical sights or senses that feed in.

This gross or material knowledge is of the lower mode. It can be altered based on physical conditions; worldly abstractions and thus subject to variations. Because of its inconsistency and its dependency on external factors, it lacks clarity and transient.

Awareness when in an expanded state, is not subject to conditions of the physical world. It holds clarity, insight from a higher perspective and guides the being towards progress.

Awareness in its expanded state is not through the objects or senses of the world; That said, it does not rely on what is read or seen or heard. It blossoms from an inner knowing. This wisdom is constant, unaffected and untainted.

The expansion of awareness from its primitive to advanced, can be observed in the invocation of the Gayathri Mantra: **bhūr bhuvaḥ suvaḥ**

Marking the ascension from lower physical states (conditioned) to higher real states (liberated/free).

As Sai Baba had stated in Sat Charitha, when the moss is removed, it shines on its own. When the darkness is removed, Light is eminent.

Likewise, when ignorance is unveiled, knowledge shines on its own.







As a being in the gross world, one is bound to conditions of the world; causing us to remain rooted in ignorance. Towards Higher states of Awareness, what is required is effort and churning. Churning can happen through Karmic effects and/or through Guru's grace.

Of course, Faith, Compassion, Selflessness and nobility facilitate ascension in awareness.

But it is to be noted that without Bhakthi, Gnyana is neigh impossible.

All efforts of the world, can only lead to a certain point which might not open doors to higher states of awareness.

Guru's grace is all that is required.

The journey is the mastery of transformation on the path of action that leads to knowledge. (On the path of Karma, coupled with bhakthi, that leads to Gnana!!)

Quoting Adi Shankara,

It isn't yoga, if the subtle body of the individual, along with the mind, prana is unaffected.

In other words, it is yoga only when the individual consciousness is led to realizing its union with the Universal consciousness.

Our evolving into higher states of Awareness will usher in a new Age of Light.







ŚrīPāda's Call to Higher Dimensions

The Charithamrth conveys lessons of deep wisdom in gross terms, so as to make it accessible for seekers across dimensions.

Meaning: Each reader can grasp the meaning as per the state of his/her awareness, rather as that is required for him or her in their particular states of awareness.

It leads in the transition of awareness from the gross to the subtle; from the material to the higher.

So when Sripada mentions HIS Dharbar, it happened in the physical so as to give a hint to the forth coming generations of devotees; that the Dharbar can as well be happening in the subtler or higher dimensions as well.

That HIS Dharbar is not confined to conditions of time and space.

It is an eternal happening in the cosmic or boundless space.

Regarding HIS mention of the Mahasamasthan that is to be formed in the coming centuries, it can relate to both the happenings in the gross and the subtler plane. While in the gross world, it is about the establishment of the structure and the organization; it could have deeper levels of meaning on the higher realm.







Establishment of HIS Maha Samasthan could also mean the establishment of HIS Sovereignty – which means HIS rule, HIS reign.

And how does this happen in a higher level or on the plane of Truth?

On an individual level - when a being follows the path of absolute surrender and allows the Higher Self to rule over his/her limited self;

On a universal level – When collective souls wake up to this understanding and allow the expansion of their awareness, it is indeed the establishment of HIS rule.

Establishing HIS Kingdom means to allow 'bliss' and contentment being the only experience for us. Where fear or anxiety or pain or any of those lower vibrations are at the bay, away from reach.

This indeed is the highest human experience and absolute awakening to Truth. This is our inherent Nature.

Sripada's call to Golden Pithikapur, is our awakening to the Consciousness/Truth or the Self. It is our waking up to Sat Chit Ananda.

Let us contemplate....

Recalling Sripada Vallabha's words from chapter 28,

"Witness the future programme to the full satisfaction of your eyes. You will understand the significance of My incarnation and the special sportive play filled with Divine joy and mirth."







Understanding the Higher states of awareness from Sripada Charithamrth again. Quoting from Chapter 43.

Happiness is within the reach of all jeeva. But sorrow always accompanies this happiness (the nature of which is transience).

One, who has no desires, derives pure joy.

A yogi experiences ecstasy.

Bliss is a matter related to Parameswara.

So worldly knowledge may grant happiness which is transient, subject to conditions.

A higher state of awareness confers joy.

Ascending further high, one may derive ecstasy and eventually bliss.

These are constant and lets the being enjoy liberation (free from being affected by the conditions of the world).

Hence let us invoke the Higher wisdom, inherent within us.

For which, we need to first let go off our conditioning, ready to stand unveiled;

Thus discard the false knowledge, unlearn and unwind and be ready to ascend.

From Śrī Sripāda Vallabha Sahasranāma

Aum māhā kārana loka-adheesvarā ya namah

Meaning: Lord of the Higher dimensions/realms
(In other words, Lord of those in higher states of awareness).

Aum suvarnaloka pradharśa kā ya namaḥ

Meaning: Lord Who reveals the joy of the higher states of awareness (Or Who brought to perceptibility, the higher/golden realms of existence).







Symbolism of the Three Heads

It is well known that most often Dattatreya is depicted with three heads.

Datta Purana, and the ancient Dattatreya Upanishad states Dattatreya physically appeared with One face only.

Even Sripada Charithamrth testifies to this statement saying Sripada Vallabha bore the exact resemblance to Dattatreya of yore.

So what about this depiction with three heads?

As we all know, Ancient Scriptures are handed down to us through time.

Any depiction or description is veiled with several layers of deeper wisdom.

It holds a variety of currents within itself. Each revealing its deeper essence to those ready to receive the same.

Unravelling the layers of meaning, requires 'Faith' and 'Patience' as Baba often states.

The three heads denote the Primordial Power, Absolute Mastery in Ichcha, Gnyana and Kriya. Dattatreya is addressed as

Adi Guru Rupa Iccha Shakthi Gnyana Shakthi Kriya Shakthi Swarupa.

Just an intent is enough from HIS side, there is instant manifestation of the same.

This is referred to as Brahma Tatva.







Gnyana is the quintessence of 'all that is'. It is not merely knowledge. But it is the essence of absolute wisdom and realization. Here, the one who sees (seer), that which is seen (object) and the act of seeing is merged as One. Dwaita diminishes. In all that is Created or in all that is manifest, realisation of 'I am That' is realised. 'Tat Vam Asi' – Seeing/Realising Oneself to be present in all – is the ultimate Gnyana Shakthi.

With this realisation or 'gnyana' all that is created is sustained.

This is the Vishnu Tatva.

Kriya Shakthi is the act of transformation. Kriya is not to be confused with karma, which is limited and bound by conditions. While karma is born of cause and effect, reinforcing separation; Kriya is from a stand point of absolute Gnyana/realization, depicting Oneness.

Kriya is transmutation from conflict to calm; from agitation to peace; from attachment to detachment; from ego to altruism; from karma to rest.

That which is manifested by mere will,

That which is identified as One with the Self/consciousness,

Certainly has to be transformed. All that is created is subject to transformation.

This power of transformation is identified as the Rudra Tatva.

Dattatreya is empowered with these three primordial powers.

To depict the same, HE is portrayed as One with three heads for understanding.
