Endless Glory of Sripada Vallabha Charithamrutham

As long as we are trapped in self-centred thoughts and emotions, we cannot end the many problems in our personal lives or in the world, or discover the real purpose of our human life.

A radical change in how we think, feel and look at life, is needed. All that meets the physical eye – is not the only Truth. And as we delve deeper in to the core essence of Charithamrutham, we realise the many dimensions of existence and the many realities around us, which can only be perceived by yogic insight.

On the material aspect of it, the sacred Text inspires one to think beyond the self, to do good unto others without expectation. To rise in empathy, compassion and grow towards living the Anasuya tatva. The law of right living propounded here is the basis of all other laws of right living.

On a subtler level, the Text helps us connect with our true nature as pure consciousness and in uniting the individual human being with the universal and transcendent consciousness. The highest and the most secret knowledge has also been explained.

In short, Charithamrutham serves as a gate opening to a new world of spiritual truth and experience.

Charithamrutham guides us on how to develop higher awareness.

Charithamrutham leads the way forward.





Charithamrutham is indeed the infinite, boundless sea whose bottom cannot be gauged. It holds precious treasure. One may spend a whole lifetime fathoming its depths and still not touch the bottom or gauge how deep it is. One may search for a hundred years and still find it difficult to gather even a one by hundredth the treasure contained within.

If with faith and humility, one may approach the Charithamrutham, the treasure is theirs in the palm of their hands. It can transform those who are mute to scholarly eloquence; the faithless are filled with faith; the lame can scale peaks.





The Logo of Sripada Vallabha Bhaktha Samaj

From null to fulfilment, how the logo evolved through time.. as Sripada Vallabha inspired and led, in every stage.





This platform shall serve as a boat, ferrying the devotees, from the shore of ignorance (darkness or duality) to HIS Shore of Light (oneness / wisdom) – was the first hint given by Sripada Swami.

And that HIS own hands shall stir the boat across the waters of turbulence / samsara.

And thence the coracle (boat made of bamboo, light weight and almost circular) which was used until the recent past to fetch devotees across River Krishna to reach Kuruvapur, the eternal abode of Sripada Vallabha.

With HIS hand at the head – The boat operates under HIS control alone – is loud and clear.

Sripada's presence here, is constant.

Unchangeable.

Undiminished.

Representing the Paramatma Tatva – The Eternal; and hence, represents the number 9.





To reach the Changeless Paramatva Tatva, one has to transcend or go beyond the dualities in Creation. Hence, the number 2 - symbolising the dual forces – cause and effect; Purusha and Prakrithi, represented as the forces of Light and Water – Heat and Cold, the dualities in energies seeping through the two channels, Ida and Pingala, corresponding to the principles - masculine and feminine.

Unless a balance is achieved, the energy does not rise through the middle channel – sushumna, which helps one understand the higher dimensions or subtler facets of Creation.

The dualities coexist. When one manifests, the other remain latent. In the shadow of happiness, sorrow, pain, or pleasure lurk their opposites.

To approach both with equality and harmony, requires spiritual strength. Equipose attitude of acceptance, towards the pairs of opposites is the highest of virtues. He who conquers his mind and senses can approach the dualities with equipose. He is neither disturbed by what happens nor causes any disturbance to others.

The duality of knower and the known is responsible for delusion and ignorance. When it is transcended through spiritual effort, one becomes free from bondage and attains all knowing awareness.

For a jivatma to rise to higher states, foremost, he has to learn to transcend the pair of opposites.

The two sides of a coin, here seen as the force of Light and water – on either sides of the circle, in fact the two phases forming the circle itself.





The number 4 is deeply symbolic. It represents the structured manifestation of cosmic order.

Time itself is structured in 4 repeating ages – Satya, Treta, Dwapara, Kali

Vedic knowledge is again four-fold – Rig, Yajur, Sama, Atharva

The directions primarily classified into 4 and so are the seasons primarily in 4 phases.

To reach the ultimate, one has to transcend the 4 States of Consciousness

Jāgrat – Waking

Svapna – Dream

Suṣupti – Deep sleep

Turiya – The transcendental state

To even reach the fourth state of Turya, or experience transcendence, one has to be aware of the 4 phases of speech.

Sripada Charithamrutham states in chapter 50, Sripada Swami's word on – observing caution as one utters a word. As the spoken word carries vibration of its own, it is important that the words we speak contain no ignobility.

The word which is manifest is the vaikaari vaak. Prior to that is the Madhyama and earlier is the pasyanthi. Prior to that is the para – which is just in energy form, until it develops to an intention to the word at the mid level, until it is audible in the gross state as the manifest or spoken word (the vaikaari vaak).

When we approach from the angle of Sree Vidhya, we still observe 4.





The Para Sakthi, Pasyanthi (ichchaa shakthi or will), Madhyama (gnyana or knowledge), Vaikaari (kriya or action).

With the knowledge of all the tatva thus mentioned, one can transcend the four bodies of oneself, they being – the gross or physical (sthula), the subtle body comprising the emotional and mental (Sukshma), the casual (karana), the sheath of intellect (maha karana), before one arrives at the actual – the ananda (the sheath of bliss, which is the real SELF).

As one transcends the four koshas, one experiences the state of ananda which is the Nature of the Self.

This anandamaia kosha, Sripada Swami relates to the state of Golden Pithapuram where HE resides eternally and easily accessible.

The logo is encased within the square which has its four openings; symbolising our real Self encased within the 4 shareera (sheaths or bodies).

Mapping it thus for understanding:

Vāk Level	Body	State	Śakti
Parā	Maha karana	Turiya	Sat chit ananda
Paśyanti	Kāraṇa	Suṣupti	Icchā (will)
Madhyamā	Sūkṣma	Svapna	Jñāna (wisdom)
Vaikhari	Sthūla	Jāgrat	Kriyā (action)





As one transcends the dualities and surpasses the four bodies or four phases, one witnesses the Paramatman (represented by number 9), and thus wins over maya shakthi (transience) symbolised by number 8. This maya is also akin to the waters of samsara where people are caught in the whirlpools of maya.

Only with the grace of the Guru, one can transcend them to reach the Ultimate.

Thus this logo too, developed itself in 4 stages and has finally arrived, aligning itself with Sripada Sri Vallabha's Sankalp.

Initially, only the hand was visible; and then the coracle came by. Then the circle with two equal halves (along with the waters) and then the enclosure with its 4 gates.

Those who care for cows are indeed dear to Me – Sripada Vallabha, Chapter 18.

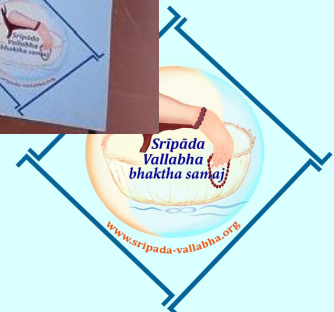
Let's give our 1% to this.
